VEGETABLE PAN BAKED FRIED RICE

INGREDIENTS:

- 1½ cups rice
- 1 carrot, finely diced
- ½ head broccoli, cut small florets
- 3 spring onions, finely chopped
- 1 cup frozen peas
- 400gm tin bean sprouts
- 1 cup frozen corn kernels
- 2 brown onions, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, crushed
- 2 tspns fresh ginger, grated
- 2 tbsps soy sauce, plus extra to serve
- 2 eggs
- 2½ cups boiling water
- 2 tspns vegetable oil

METHOD:

1. Preheat the oven to 180c fan forced.
2. Place the rice in a tray. Add garlic and ginger. Pour in the water and add the oil. Stir to combine. Cover dish tightly with foil and bake for 45 minutes
3. Carefully uncover the dish and stir in the carrot, broccoli, onion, peas, corn and spring onion. Add soy sauce and stir. Cover tightly and cook a further 10 minutes.
4. Remove and discard foil. Pour beaten egg mix through and mix through the rice. And cook for a further 7 minutes.
5. Serve.

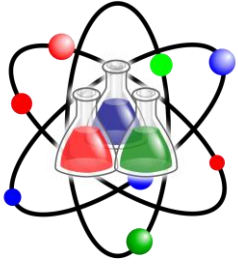
